I hope this message finds you well. I am reaching out to share an important update on the progress of the [REDACTED], which is kicking into full swing sooner than anticipated.

Due to unforeseen electrical issues, it's become necessary to temporarily vacate the [REDACTED] office by March 27th. This move is aimed at providing our team with a workspace free from the hustle and bustle of the construction zone.

Here's what this means for our teams at [REDACTED], as well as our teams at [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]:

Relocation Period: The relocation will start March 18th in phases and is expected to last until July. We understand that a change in workspace can be an adjustment, and we appreciate everyone's flexibility during this period.
